- [Listen to an excerpt](#) - *Internment* - set in near-future America where Muslims are sent to internment camps following a law enacted by the islamophobic president

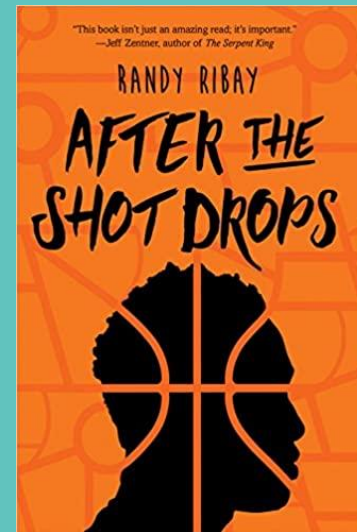


RANDY RIBAY

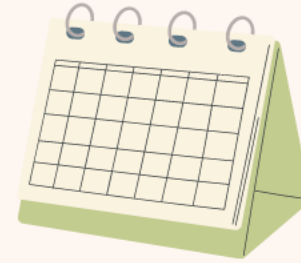

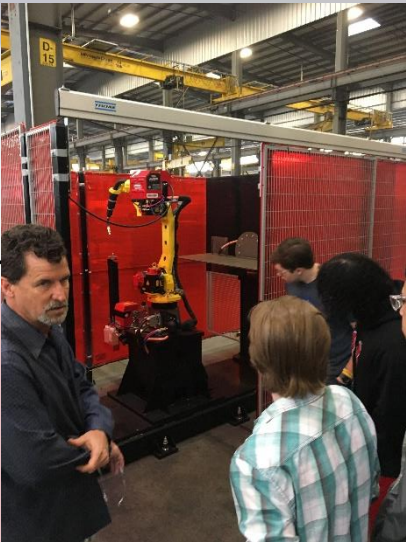

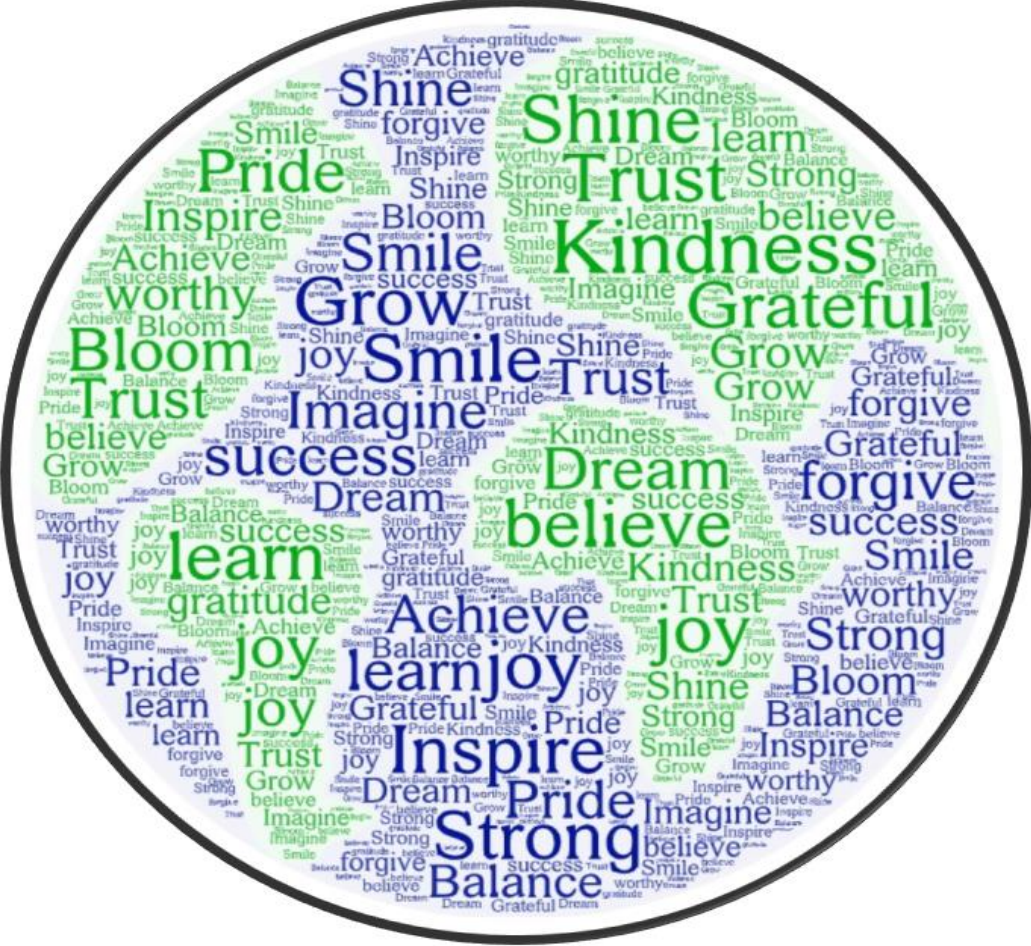
