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What is Dual Credit?

- Houston Community College (HCC) provides high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit and high school credit through enrollment with HCC while in high school
- Any high school student or homeschooled student who is currently enrolled in 9th grade (eligible starting their spring semester) or higher may be eligible for dual credit. Students demonstrating college readiness through a State of Texas approved college placement test can earn dual credit by taking an approved college class offered at a high school, HCC campus, or online
- At little to no cost, students can begin their college careers while still in high school

Definitions

- **Traditional Dual Credit Students** are enrolled in college courses and receive both high school and college credit
- **Early College High School Students** have the opportunity to receive a high school diploma, associate degree or at least 60 college hours towards a baccalaureate degree
- **P-TECH Students** work towards a Career and Technical Education (CTE) degree while gaining hands-on work experience
- **HCC Canvas** is the Learning Management System (LMS) that supports learning and teaching. It provides students access to their grades, course information, and assignments
- **Learning Options** include Online Anytime, Online on a Schedule, and Lab-Based Courses
