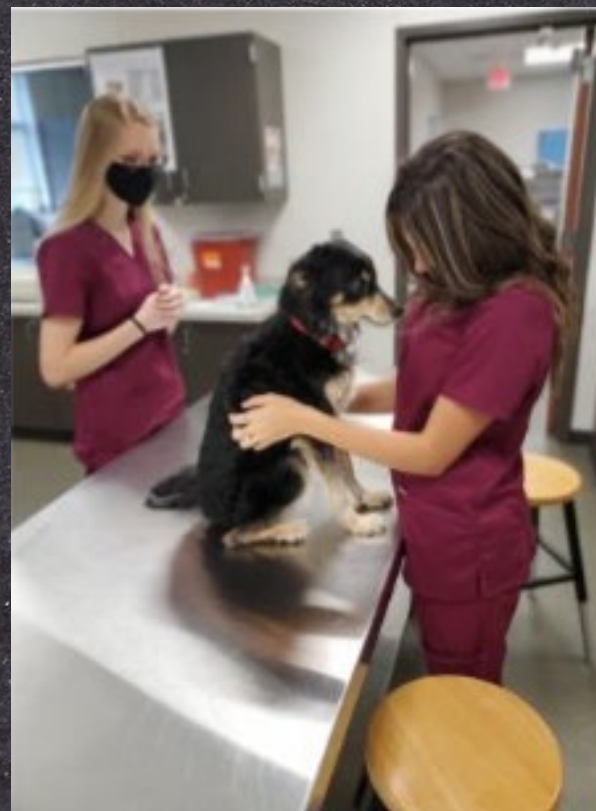

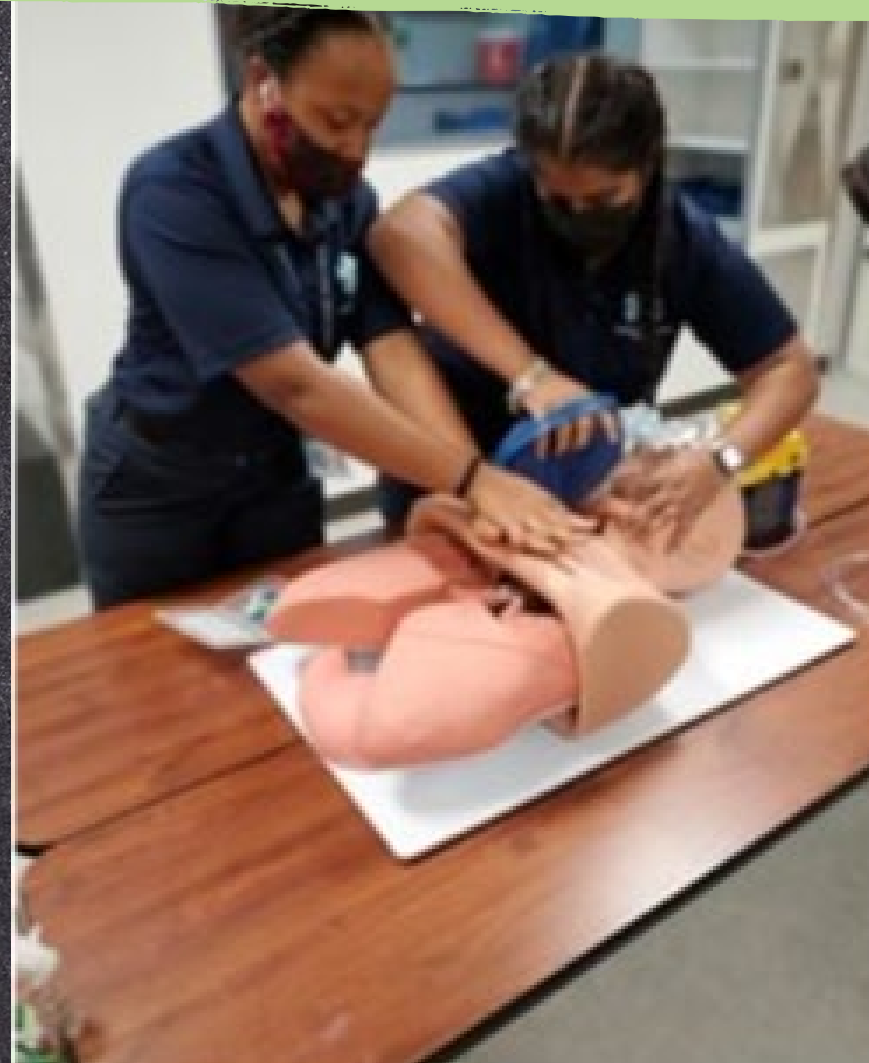

WHAT ARE MY SCHEDULING OPTIONS?

Select courses will be offered in a variety of formats to offer students flexibility and choice.

In addition to traditional face-to-face, some courses may be taken virtually as part of the instructional day, and some may still be taken virtually outside of the school day with a fee.



HOW CAN I TAKE A VIRTUAL COURSE?

As a 9th grader, you can select **one (1)** virtual course offering to be taken during the instructional day. You will have a study hall during the day, while the virtual course is asynchronous.

Additionally, you can choose up to **two (2)** tuition-based virtual courses that are scheduled outside of the instructional day.



WHEN ARE VIRTUAL COURSES SCHEDULED?

Instructional Day (ID) Virtual Courses are scheduled in 3 ways within the 7 period day:

- with a **Study Hall** (only option for 9th graders)
- with a **Late Arrival***
- with an **Early Release***

*LATE ARRIVAL & EARLY RELEASE ARE FOR 10-12TH GRADE AND REQUIRE OWN TRANSPORTATION

Tuition-Based Virtual Courses (formerly KVS) are scheduled outside of the Instructional Day.



WHICH COURSES ARE AVAILABLE VIRTUALLY?

Courses available to 9th graders for Instructional Day (ID) are:

- Health (one semester)
- Professional Communications (one semester)
- Lifetime Fitness & Wellness Pursuits - PE
- Art Appreciation

- World Geography & AP Human Geography



OTHER 9TH GRADE NOTES

Beginning with the Class of 2029 and thereafter, health and speech credits will no longer be required for graduation. They remain options as elective courses. State health and speech requirements will be met through English courses (speech) and demonstrated mastery of a health module.

In 10th grade: You can select up to **two (2)** virtual courses during the day & **one (1)** may include late arrival or early release.

CREDITS- WHAT ARE THEY?

- ★ PASSING A CLASS FOR THE YEAR = ONE CREDIT
- ★ 0.5 CREDITS ARE EARNED EACH SEMESTER
- ★ SIX WEEKS GRADES AVERAGED WITH FINAL EXAM ACCOUNT FOR YOUR SEMESTER GRADE. ONLY THE SEMESTER GRADE IS CALCULATED INTO GPA AND IS REPORTED ON THE TRANSCRIPT.
- ★ GPA IS CUMMULATIVE AND GETS RECALCULATED TO INCLUDE EACH SEMESTER. RANK IS RECALCULATED AS WELL.
- ★ 9TH GRADE BEGINS THE BLUEPRINT FOR YOUR HIGH SCHOOL CAREER.

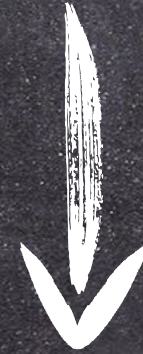

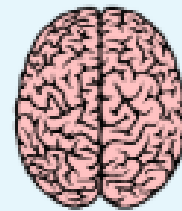

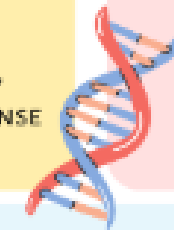


KAP BIOLOGY

DON'T EXPECT EVERYTHING TO COME AS EASY TO YOU AS IT DID IN JUNIOR HIGH. YOU'RE GOING TO HAVE TO WORK HARD AND PUT EFFORT IN IF YOU WANT TO GET GOOD GRADES. BUT ALSO DON'T GIVE UP IF YOU DON'T DO GOOD RIGHT AWAY, TAKE THAT AS MOTIVATION TO WORK HARDER.

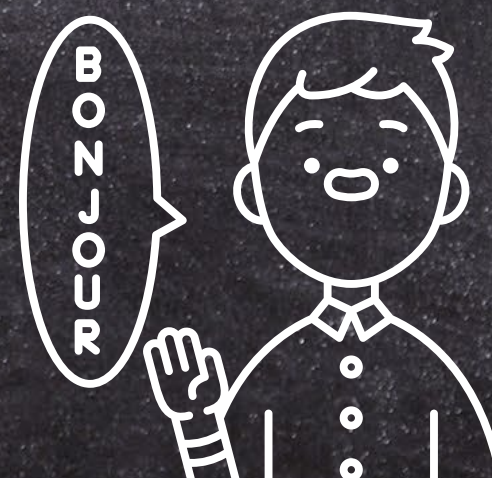




CHOOSING A FOREIGN LANGUAGE:

STUDENTS WILL NEED 2 YEARS OF LEVEL I AND LEVEL II OF A FOREIGN LANGUAGE. IF YOU ARE TAKING SPANISH I IN 8TH GRADE, YOU WILL TAKE SPANISH II IN 9TH. SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS 1 AND 2, YOU WILL TAKE SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS 3 AND 4.

SOME STUDENTS CAN WAIT TO TAKE THEIR FOREIGN LANGUAGE IN 10TH GRADE IF THEY HAVE NOT STARTED IN THE 8TH GRADE.






CHOOSING PE COURSES AND FINE ARTS

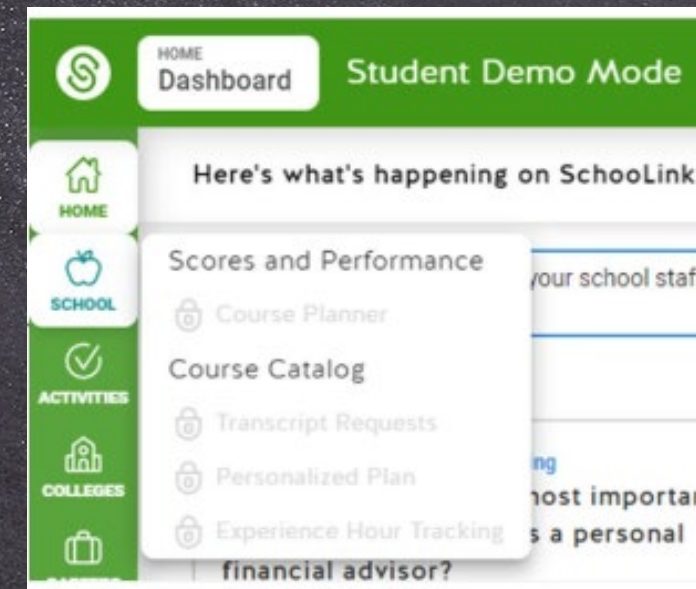

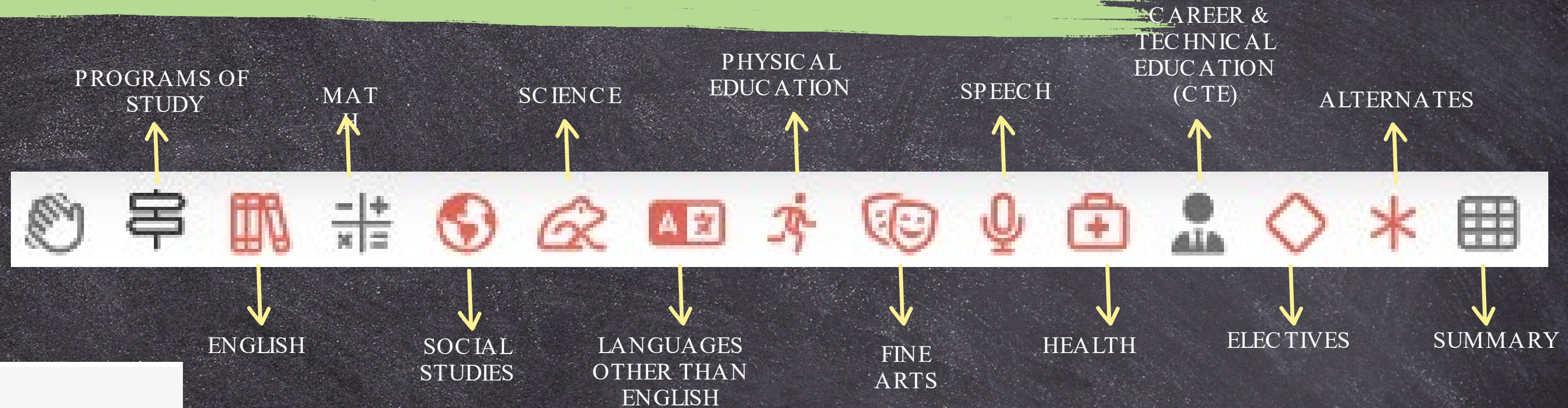

KATY ISD SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY

Once course verification has been completed, schedule changes for the 2025-2026 school year will be allowed only in the following cases:

- ★ ERROR IN SCHEDULE BY THE SCHOOL (DATA ENTRY ERROR).
- ★ STUDENT HAS NOT MET COURSE PREREQUISITES.
- ★ STUDENT HAS ALREADY EARNED CREDIT FOR THE COURSE
- ★ CHANGE IN PROGRAM (ATHLETICS, FINE ARTS, ETC).
- ★ LEVEL CHANGES AS RECOMMENDED BY THE TEACHER AND COUNSELOR, WITH PARENT AND PRINCIPAL APPROVAL.
- ★ STUDENT DID NOT MEET STANDARD ON STAAR/EOC EXAM.

The Foundation High School Program + Endorsement requires a total of 26 credits.

Grade level classification is the same for all students, regardless of graduation plan. Students are classified based on the number of academic credits they have earned at the beginning of the school year.

All students who have completed 8th grade enter high school as freshman, regardless of the number of high school credits they may have already earned through junior high, summer school, credit by exam and/or online learning.

DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT (DLA)

The distinguished level of achievement (DLA) is earned through successful completion of:

- ★ All requirements for the Foundation High School Program, plus

- * • The requirements of a least one endorsement, including

- ★ Algebra II among the four required math credits, and

- ★ A fourth science credit

{ A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) to be considered for the top 10% and eligibility for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university. }

ALGEBRA II NOTICE

ALGEBRA II IS NOT SPECIFIED AS A GRADUATION REQUIREMENT; HOWEVER, STUDENTS WHO DO NOT EARN ALGEBRA II ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR:

- ★ earning the Distinguished level of achievement (DLA), which requires completion on an endorsement with algebra 2 among the four math credits,
- ★ Recognition as an honors or high honors graduate,
- ★ Automatic admission to a state public college or university, and
- ★ Certain financial aid opportunities, including the TEXAS grant or the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant.



TOP 10% RULE

A STUDENT WHOSE CLASS RANK IS IN THE TOP 10 PERCENT OF THE GRADUATING CLASS MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR AUTOMATIC ADMISSION CONSIDERATION AT A TEXAS PUBLIC COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.



Class rank must be based on the student's rank at the end of the 11th grade, middle of 12th grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the college or university's application deadline.

A STUDENT IN THE TOP 10% PERCENT OF THE GRADUATION CLASS IS ELIGIBLE FOR AUTOMATIC ADMISSION CONSIDERATION AT TEXAS PUBLIC COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN WHICH IS TOP 5% OF THEIR CLASS.

TOP 10% RULE

REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY FOR AUTOMATIC ADMISSION CONSIDERATION"

- ★ Complete the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement,
- ★ Earn a satisfactory ACT or SAT score,
- ★ Submit the application before the college or university's deadline, and
- ★ Provide a final high school transcript verifying completion of the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement.
