### Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA)

- The Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) is earned through successful completion of:
- ·All requirements for the Foundation High School Program, <u>plus</u>
- The requirements of <u>at least one</u> endorsement, including

Algebra II among the four required math credits

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) to be considered for the Top 10% and eligibility for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university.

### TOP 10% Rule

A student whose class rank\* is in the top 10 percent of the graduating class may be eligible for automatic admission consideration at a Texas public college or university.

\*Class rank must be based on the student's rank at the end of the 11<sup>th</sup> grade, middle of 12<sup>th</sup> grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the college or university's application deadline.

UT Austin has lowered it's automatic admission threshold to top 5%.

#### State End-of-Course Testing Requirements

The following 5 end-of-course (EOC) assessments are required:

- ✓ English I
- ✓ English II
- ✓ Algebra I
- ✔ Biology
- ✓ US History

The student must pass each of the five EOC assessments to meet state graduation requirements.

### Texas First Early High School Completion Program

The Texas First Program recognizes high-achieving students and enables eligible students to graduate early with the Distinguished Level of Achievement and receive a scholarship.

Texas First Program offers eligible students an opportunity to earn up to a year in scholarship money to attend any Texas public institution of higher education, including colleges, universities, and technical colleges.

There is no guarantee students will get their first-choice electives or courses.


### Schedule Changes

- ☐ Schedule Changes for the school year will be allowed only in the following cases:
  - Error in scheduling by the school (data entry error);
  - Student has not met course prerequisites;
  - Student has already earned credit for the course;
  - Change in program (athletics, fine arts, etc.);
  - Level changes as recommended by the teacher and counselor, with parent and principal approval;
  - Student did not meet standard on STAAR/EOC exam.


NO elective changes will be honored after the course selection window has closed. Schedule changes will not be honored throughout the school year, so choose your courses carefully.



### Dual Credit Enrollment

- A system in which an eligible high school student successfully completes a college course(s) that is paired to a high school course and receives credit for the course on both the college and the high school transcripts.
- Dual Credit courses in KISD are generally taught by a KISD teacher who is also employed by Houston Community College. There may be times when the course is taught online by an HCC professor. If possible, the student will be placed in a "study hall" class period to provide them with school day time to work on their online college class.
- Dual credit courses are college classes first and high school classes second.
  - Students and teachers are required to follow all HCC policies, i.e. attendance, grading, academic honesty, etc.

# KISD Approved DC CTE Courses/Programs

- Student must be seeking the Health Science Endorsement.
- Student must take Principles of Health Sciences in 8th, 9<sup>th</sup>, or 10<sup>th</sup> grade to complete the Medical Assisting program.
- Takes two years in high school to complete dual credit courses required for the certificate program.








## KISD Approved DC CTE Courses/Programs

- Student must take Principles of Education & Training in 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Requires specific core dual credit courses in addition to special dual credit dual credit education courses.

- All courses transfer to the University of Houston Victoria campus in Katy where students will complete their Bachelor of Arts in Teaching
- Complete required observation hours and Student Teach in KISD
- Earn a Bachelors degree within 2 years of high school graduation

### Dual Credit Enrollment

- Specific sequence of courses students must take starting freshman in order to complete CTE Level 1 or associate degree programs
- The majority of student credit courses become available to students starting their junior year in high school.
- Only dual credit course freshman can take is dual credit BIM (Business Information Management)
- Most dual credit courses require students to be college level ready
  - Must meet specific requirements on the ACT, SAT, or TSIA2
