#### Title I Program

The Title I program offers support to meet the specific needs of students who exhibit an academic need. Campus eligibility is based on the percentage of students who participate in the district free/or reduced lunch program. Title I programs are designed to improve the educational opportunities of children and help them:

- Succeed in the general education program.
- Attain grade level proficiency.
- Improve achievement in basic and advanced skills.
- Grow every student academically.
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#### The Law

The 2001 reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, PL 107-110, generally known as No Child Left Behind, requires:

- School districts have a written policy regarding parental involvement.
- Parents be involved in the development, operation, and

evaluation of the Title I program.

- Parents must be informed about the qualifications of their children's teachers, and that all of the school's teachers must be highly qualified.



#### Goals of Title I Parent Involvement

1. Inform parents of the specific instructional objectives and methods of the program.
2. Support the efforts of parents to work with their children in the home to attain the instructional objectives of the program.
3. Consult with parents concerning the manner in which the school and parents can work together to achieve instructional objectives.
4. Provide a comprehensive range of opportunities for parents to be informed and involved in the design and evaluation of the program.
5. Ensure opportunities for participation of parents regardless of language and literacy levels.

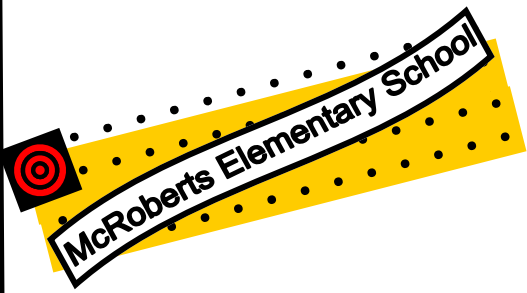
