Parent Family Engagement (PFE) Policy

2023-2024

Statement of Purpose

Morton Ranch Junior High believes that our school should positively impact the community by promoting student achievement and social-emotional growth for all students. The campus priorities include improving achievement in math and reading, providing character education to promote social-emotional growth, and to support our Emergent Bilingual students with more resources for language acquisition. All students will receive extensive academic support in the areas of math and reading through before and after school tutorials, intervention courses, and online opportunities such as Imagine Math and Freckle. All students will participate in character education with the implementation of Character Strong lessons and Project Class. Lastly, our emergent bilingual students will be provided with intervention before, during, and after school and teachers will be provided with training in building language rich classrooms. An integral part of achieving these goals is through the support of our families and community.

A PFE policy is designed to promote parental involvement that supports our school's mission and vision as well as our goals through Title I Part A. An advisory team will annually review, evaluate, and modify this policy to better support our campus goals. Our PFE was created jointly with the parents, community, and teachers of MRJH. The PFE will be distributed during our Annual Title I meeting, at all school sponsored events, through our website, and linked on weekly communication emails. The PFE will be translated into the languages that represent our student population.

An annual Title I meeting shall convene at varying times and days in which all families of MRJH student's will be invited and encouraged to attend. The goal of the annual meeting is to inform parents of our goals for Title I and review our campus needs assessment. A description of the PFE Policy will be shared and a survey will be distributed for feedback from parents. The Campus Advisory Team will be responsible for inviting, conducting, and distributing all matters relating to the Annual Title I Meeting.

The effectiveness of our programs and parental involvement will be evaluated throughout the year. Data will be collected through surveys and feedback for more effective parental involvement. Modifications and ways to improve our practices will be reviewed and reported.

Title I Funds will be allocated towards student achievement and social-emotional growth. The Campus Advisory Team, parents, and teachers will have input into the use of funds. Funds may be used for professional development, extended day activities, instructional materials, program implementation, staff salaries, and parent involvement opportunities. MRJH will distribute valuable information about the curriculum, grading policies, and testing calendars. The KISD website also provides this information. News related to Title I will be posted on the MRJH website, in the school newsletter, on the marquee, through social media, and fliers.

Developing the Policy

An Advisory committee was formed consisting of parents, community members, teachers, and administrators to develop the Morton Ranch Junior High's Parent and Family Engagement (PFE) Policy. The parent volunteers will represent the diversity of the student population and a translator will be present. The committee will meet to write, revise, and publish the PFE Policy that will encourage and support parental involvement at MRJH. The PFE Policy is a fluid document and can be revised based on the needs of our stakeholders.

Morton Ranch Junior High held its first PFE Meeting to discuss the goals of the Campus Improvement Plan and solicited feedback from the parents about the goals. The first meeting was held on August 10, 2023 at 4:30pm in the LGI at MRJH. The PFE committee presented on how MRJH became a Title I school and what it means to be a Title I school as well as reviewed our goals and discussed how it will positively impact our campus. We built capacity through activities that promoted honest feedback and to show our parents that we are all working together to achieve our Title I goals.

The second PFE Meeting was held on Thursday 8/24 at 5:30pm in the MRJH LGI and the purpose was to create the Parent-School Compact. We reviewed MRJH's goals of Title I and how being a Title I school positively impacts our campus. We built capacity with an icebreaker where the PFE committee discussed famous compacts in history and their importance throughout the world. The PFE committee agreed upon the statements that best reflected how MRJH, parents, and students could support student achievement. All committee members agreed upon the Parent-School Compact and the compact will be distributed to parents on Monday 8/28 during "Back to School Night." The compact is available in English and in Spanish.

Annual Meetings

Morton Ranch Junior High will conduct multiple annual Title I meetings at the beginning of the year and in the spring for all parents to introduce the Title I program and provide updates to any changes made. At the meeting, the Title I program will be described, the PFE policy will be distributed and opportunities for parental participation will be explained.

The first annual Title I meeting will take place during "Back to School Night" on Monday August 28, 2023 at 5:00pm in the MRJH Cafeteria. All distributable materials and the presentation will be translated into the language representing our campus. The second Annual Meeting will take place on

Saturday October 14, 2023 at 9:00am in the MRJH Cafeteria . Parents will be informed through electronic correspondence such as The Maverick Mail and the Remind App, distributed invitations from the campus, and posted fliers. We will also host an annual Title I meeting in the spring to review the progress we have made on the Campus Improvement Plan.

Additionally, the evaluation of the Title I program and PFE will be conducted through a survey that will be available online in multiple languages to reach as many parents as possible. These surveys will be geared toward how to help support student achievement and parental involvement. Parents are encouraged to be involved in their child's education and offer suggestions as we work together to ensure their child succeeds at Morton Ranch Junior High.

Building Capacity

Morton Ranch Junior High values the partnership of the parents in their children's education. During the creation of the PFE, parents, staff, and administrators met to build capacity and further develop a partnership. Through the activities conducted and the surveys administered, we have created a School-Parent Compact that supports the Title I initiatives at MRJH.

Morton Ranch Junior High will:

Programs and the School Community

Annually, the Title I program at Morton Ranch Junior High will assess the needs of the identified Title I students and parents within our school community. A variety of tools will be utilized to determine

the effectiveness of our Title I program including but not limited to surveys and questionnaires distributed throughout the year. The CAT team will review the information and revise our CIP and PFE to better serve our students.

Our staff is also diligent at monitoring student achievement and academic progress through the use of formative and summative assessments. This data guides the staff's implementation of instruction and TEKS to provide more support to students. Data is always used to differentiate instruction to meet the needs of all learners.

Workshops and trainings will be provided to educators and parents to address the specific needs of our campus. Parents will be notified of these trainings and opportunities through all means of communication.

School-Parent Communication

Morton Ranch Junior High will communicate with parents on a weekly basis. Important information will be provided in the KISD Student Handbook, "Guide to Curriculum" pamphlet, the School-Parent Compact, the PFE, and on the district website. Notification about individual students will be provided to parents every 3 weeks. Parents will be notified at those times about their student's academic achievements and means to improve if necessary. This information will be disseminated by email, phone calls home, and/or conferences. When possible, all communication will be provided in the home language of the student and in a format parents can understand.
