THE COMMUNITY

Katy High School is the original high school in Katy, TX and has served the community for over 125 years. Each year multigenerational graduates are recognized at graduation, with multiple fourth and fifth generation graduates. The community is an integral part of the KHS experience.

SCHOOL FACTS

Katy High School is a public, four year secondary school with an enrollment of over 3,550 students in grades nine through twelve. KHS has over 200 members in its teaching faculty. Katy High School has earned many recognitions for its athletic, fine arts and academic programs.

The school day consists of seven class periods which meet five days a week. Each class period is approximately 50 minutes in length. The school year is divided into two semesters with three six-week marking periods in each semester.

CLASS RANK

KISD uses a weighted 4.0 grading scale. Class Rank is based on a cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12, plus high school courses taken in junior high and credits earned via preapproved Katy ISD provider(s). Students are officially ranked for the first time after the fifth semester in high school.

Katy ISD only ranks the top 10% of the senior class. Quartile will only be populated on transcripts for students who are in the 1st. 2nd or 3rd quartile. Quartile will not show for students in the 4th guartile or students new to Katy ISD. A full year, one period course consisting of two semesters is equivalent to one credit.

DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT

- The requirements of at least one endorsement.

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement to be considered for the Top 10% and eligible for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university. PERFORMANCE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

A student may earn a performance acknowledgement in one or more of the following categories:

- AP test score of 3 or above:
- IB test score of 4 or above (applies to transfer students only as the International Baccalaureate program is not offered in Katy ISD);
- Outstanding performance on the PSAT, SAT or ACT;
- Completion of at least 12 hours college coursework with final grades of A or B (3.0 GPA or above);
- Bilingualism and biliteracy; and
- Earning a state, nationally or internationally recognized business or industry certification or license.
